Notice on Lawsuit Filed Against Toshiba

TOKYO — Toshiba Corporation (TOKYO: 6502) today announced that yesterday it was provided with a complaint of a purported class action suit against Toshiba, filed on October 3, 2017, regarding a nuclear power plant construction project in South Carolina, U.S.A.

2. Outline and background to the lawsuit

The plaintiffs are customers of South Carolina Electric & Gas Company, the principal and wholly-owned subsidiary of SCANA Corporation and Santee Cooper (“the Utilities”). The complaint seeks compensatory and other damages from Toshiba in respect of the abandonment of a project in South Carolina to construct two nuclear reactors at V.C. Summer Nuclear Station Units 2 and 3 (the “Project”), owned by the Utilities. The plaintiffs claim damages for costs that were charged to them to complete the Project. The plaintiffs seek to represent a class of customers of the Utilities who are alleged to have suffered similar damages.

4. Outline of lawsuit (amount in dispute)

Amount in dispute is not stated in the written notice.

5. Future schedule

Toshiba plans to carefully examine the lawsuit, believes it has meritorious defenses, and will respond appropriately. At this moment, it is difficult for Toshiba to reasonably foresee an potential financial impact of the litigation, but Toshiba does not anticipate that it will have a significant impact on financial statements for FY2017, ending March 31, 2018. Toshiba will promptly announce any items that require disclosure.
